

# 2024-2025 WVNCC Independent Verification Worksheet

Your FAFSA was selected for review in a process called "Verification." In this process WVNCC is required to compare information from your FAFSA with other documentation such as an official IRS Tax Return Transcript or IRS Verification of Non-filing Letter for you and your spouse, if married. If you and/or your spouse, if married, were not required to file a federal tax return you must submit copies of any W-2 forms or earnings statements. The law says we have a right to ask you for this information before awarding federal aid. If there are differences between your FAFSA and your financial documents we may need to send corrections electronically to have your information reprocessed.

### What you should do

- Complete this worksheet. **ALL SECTIONS MUST BE FILLED IN.** You **MUST** sign the worksheet.
- Send or take the completed worksheet, plus copies of your and your spouse's, if married, 2022 IRS Tax Transcript or signed copy of a federal income tax return/Verification of Non-filing Letter, and 2022 W-2s (if applicable) to the Financial Aid Office or your Campus Service Center at WVNCC.

We must review the requested information under the financial aid program rules (CFR Title 34, Part 668).

## A. Family (Household) Information (verifying number in household and number in college)

List below the people in your household. Include:

- Yourself on the **first** line
- Your spouse, if married.
- You and/or your spouse's children if you or your spouse will provide **more than half** of their support from July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025, even if the children do not live with the student.
- Other people if they now live with you and you and your spouse provide **more than half** of their support and will continue to provide **more than half** of their support through June 30, 2025.

## B. Student's 2022 Income Information

- \*\* FEDERAL TAX RETURN FILERS ONLY \*\***—**Important Note:** If you (or your spouse, if married) filed, or will file, an amended 2022 Federal Income Tax Return, you must submit a signed copy of the 2022 IRS Form 1040X.

**Instructions:** Complete this section if the student filed or will file a 2022 income tax return with the IRS. *The best way to verify income is by using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool that is part of FAFSA on the Web. If you have not already used the tool, go to studentaid.gov, log in to the student's FAFSA record, select "Make FAFSA Corrections," and navigate to the "Student Financials" section of the form. From there, follow the instructions to determine if the student is eligible to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool to transfer 2022 IRS income tax information into the student's FAFSA.*

Check only one box below:

- Check here if you used the IRS Data Retrieval Tool in FAFSA on the Web to retrieve and transfer 2022 IRS income information for you (and your spouse, if married) without altering the data into the FAFSA, either on the initial FAFSA or when making a correction to the FAFSA. **WVNCC will use the IRS information that was transferred in the verification process. YOU DO NOT NEED TO PROVIDE A COPY OF A 2022 IRS TAX RETURN TRANSCRIPT.**

**WVNCC cannot complete the verification process until the IRS information has been transferred without altering the data into the FAFSA -or- you submit to WVNCC a 2022 IRS tax return transcript or a signed copy of your federal income tax return (Form 1040) for you (and your spouse, if married)**

*To obtain an IRS tax return transcript, go to [www.irs.gov](http://www.irs.gov) and click on "Get Your Tax Record" on the main/home screen. Select either "Get Transcript Online" or "Get Transcript by Mail" and follow the prompts. Make sure to request the "IRS tax return transcript" and not the "IRS tax account transcript." You will need your Social Security Number, date of birth, and the address on file with the IRS (normally this will be the address used when the 2022 IRS tax return was filed). It takes up to two weeks for IRS income information to be available for electronic IRS tax return filers, and up to eight weeks for paper IRS tax return filers.*

If the student and spouse filed separate 2022 IRS income tax returns, **2022 IRS Tax Return Transcripts or signed copies of federal income tax returns (Form 1040)** must be provided for both.

- Check here if you are attaching a copy of your (and your spouse's, if married) 2022 IRS Tax Return Transcript(s) or a signed copy of federal income tax return(s) (Form 1040) to this worksheet.

List below your employer(s) and any income received in 2022. **You are required to submit an IRS Verification of Non-filing Letter and all 2022 W-2 forms or other earnings statements.**

Check the box that applies:

Check here if you (and if married, your spouse) were not employed and had no income earned from work in 2022. You are required to submit a **2022 IRS Verification of Non-filing Letter for you and your spouse (if applicable)** – To obtain a Verification of Non-filing letter, go to [www.irs.gov](http://www.irs.gov) and click on “Get Your Tax Record” on the main/home screen. Select “Get Transcript Online” and follow the prompts. For transcript type you must select “Verification of Non-filing Letter.” If you are unable to get the transcript online, one may be ordered by filling out a 4506-T form or calling 1-800-908-9946.

Effective 1/9/19: If you (or your spouse) are unable to obtain the Verification of Non-filing (VNF) from the IRS or other tax authorities, you must provide the following information to the Financial Aid Office to determine your eligibility for financial aid based on the certification that you did not file and are not required to file an income tax return for the 2022 tax year –

- **A signed statement** (Form available upon request) certifying that you (or your spouse) –
  - **Attempted to obtain the VNF from the IRS or other tax authorities and was unable to obtain the required documentation;** and
  - Has not filed and is not required to file a 2022 income tax return

Check here if you (and if married, your spouse) were employed in 2022. Attach copies of all 2022 IRS W-2 forms issued to the student (and if married, your spouse) by employers. List any employer that did not issue an IRS W-2 form in the space below. If more space is needed, attach a separate page with the student's name and Student ID number at the top.

In addition you are required to submit a **2022 IRS Verification of Non-filing Letter for you and your spouse (if applicable)** – To obtain a Verification of Non-filing letter, go to [www.irs.gov](http://www.irs.gov) and click on “Get Your Tax Record” on the main/home screen. Select “Get Transcript Online” and follow the prompts. For transcript type you must select “Verification of Non-filing Letter.” If you are unable to get the transcript online, one may be ordered by filling out a 4506-T form or calling 1-800-908-9946.

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- **A signed statement** (Form available upon request) certifying that you (or your spouse) –
  - **Attempted to obtain the VNF from the IRS or other tax authorities and was unable to obtain the required documentation;** and
  - Has not filed and is not required to file a 2022 income tax return

**Note:** If you are married and filed “married, filing separately,” you will be required to submit an IRS tax return transcript or a signed copy of a federal income tax return (Form 1040) for both you and your spouse. If you are married and you and/or your spouse did not file a 2022 tax return, you will be required to submit an IRS verification of non-filing letter for you and/or your spouse.
