"Seemingly at every turn, West Virginia is announcing that another business is choosing to locate or expand here..." This year, we announced that West Virginia's college-going rate – the number of high school seniors who enroll in either a community college or a four-year institution after graduation – dipped to 45.9 percent for the graduating class of 2021. This was down from 48.2 percent in 2020, and 50.5 percent in 2019.

These aren't just troubling numbers; these are concerning realities for our young people – and for our state's future. It is undeniable that the COVID-19 pandemic affected our students' education and, potentially, their plans after high school graduation. But I believe there is so much more to the story – and that's why our office is doubling down on efforts to support students more strongly than ever before in getting the training or education they need to be successful.

What we're seeing in West Virginia with our college-going rate isn't unique to our state. It is undoubtedly a nationwide trend. But we have the capacity here to expand on and create new efforts to help our young people focus on their futures.

In talking with students throughout the year, what we've found is that they are thinking about college from a much different perspective. It's no longer about which institution they'd like to attend just for the college experience. Instead, and much more wisely, they're thinking about higher education in terms of the careers and future it can assure them.

Seemingly at every turn, West Virginia is announcing that another business is choosing to locate or expand here – creating and preserving good-paying jobs for our people. But the other insight we've gained in talking with students this year is that they simply don't know about these jobs. Many of them want to stay here, in their home state, but they don't believe there are opportunities for them after they earn a credential. So, how can we better share the message that those opportunities do exist, and that completing training or education after high school is the best path forward to take full advantage of them?

Our office is continuing to build new programming and resources to deliver the promise of an education and rewarding career opportunities to students right here at home. This year, we implemented a new student financial aid management system to simplify the process of connecting students with an array of grants and scholarships. We continue our statewide outreach through "College for West Virginia" - <u>cfwv.com</u> - with information and resources to help students and families explore educational and career opportunities and plan for college. Additionally, our West Virginia GEAR UP program, which provides college planning and readiness services, is expected to serve an additional 17,500 West Virginia middle and high school students over the next seven years thanks to a \$24 million grant from the U.S. Department of Education.

These are just some of the ways our office is working to help West Virginians land and stay on a path that will lead them to promising careers. We look forward to creating even more opportunities – together with our state's leaders, agency partners, business, and industry – through policies and programming to increase the college-going rate and help more of our citizens succeed. If we do, we will build up an incredibly strong workforce that can meet the growing demands of a stronger West Virginia economy.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS

EMS WV: ANSWER THE CALL INITIATIVE

In June, Governor Jim Justice launched the EMS WV: Answer the Call initiative to address the state's need for additional Emergency Medical Services (EMS) professionals – a challenge that was exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic. Funded through \$10 million in CARES Act dollars, the program provided for, among

other efforts, the purchase of state-of-the-art mobile ambulance simulators to offer professional training in rural parts of the state, a marketing campaign highlighting EMS careers in West Virginia, and nocost EMT training through community and technical colleges and local agencies. Through the no-cost training, 862 new EMTs were trained to enter the



workforce fully credentialed. More information: emswv.com.

NURSING WORKFORCE EXPANSION

In December 2021, Governor Justice committed \$48 million to address West Virginia's nursing workforce shortage through a multi-pronged plan to train, attract, and retain nurses in the state. Higher education played a significant role in this initiative, with \$24 million dedicated to expanding enrollment in nursing programs. As a result, 716 new RN students were enrolled in expanded programs



for the 2022-23 academic year, and 94 new LPN seats were filled in expanded programs – for a total of 810 new students in the first year. The initiative also fully funded the West Virginia Nursing Scholarship program for the 2022-23 academic year, supporting 380 students. A marketing campaign nearly doubled the number of scholarship applications from

UNDERWOOD-SMITH TEACHING SCHOLARS BEGIN THEIR JOURNEY

This fall, the third cohort of Underwood-Smith Teaching Scholars started their journey at colleges and universities across the state. Twenty-seven graduating high school seniors were selected this year

to receive the state's newest and most prestigious scholarship, which was created by the Legislature in 2019, to help West Virginia address ongoing teacher shortages in the fields of math, science, special education, and elementary education. Recipients commit to teaching in one of these high-demand fields for at least five years after graduation. To give students the greatest chance at success, each is paired with a practicing classroom teacher mentor

WEST VIRGINIA INVESTS GRADUATES TO YIELD \$10 MILLION FOR STATE'S ECONOMY BY 2025

In January, a report considering the early economic effects of the West Virginia Invests grant found that the program's first two cohorts of graduates are estimated to yield a \$10 million impact on the state's economy by 2025. By comparison, the estimated tuition costs for these students were \$3.5 million. In March 2019, the West Virginia Legislature passed



Senate Bill 1, which established West Virginia Invests as a last-dollarin grant program, allowing students to use other federal and/or state financial aid awards first, with West Virginia Invests covering the remaining costs of tuition and fees for certificate or associate degree programs at the state's nine community and technical colleges. The 2022 West Virginia Higher Education Almanac provides year-end higher education statistics for both of the state's higher education systems, the West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission (Commission) and West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education (Council).

When reviewing the statistics in this report, it is important to carefully consider the data definitions for each metric, which are found at the end of the document. This is particularly important when it comes to the cohort, or group of students, of which the statistic is reflective. For example, there are fundamental differences between "full-time" and "part-time" students that can have a drastic effect on the reported data.







This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time full-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who enrolled in the spring semester of the same academic year at the same institution.

FRESHMEN COMPLETING 30 HOURS

Fall 2021 First-Time Full-Time Freshman Cohort | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time full-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who successfully completed 30 credit hours by the end of the following summer.

BACHELOR'S GRADUATION RATES (FOUR- AND SIX-YEAR)

Annual headcount enrollment values represent the total number of unique students who enrolled in credit-bearing classes or shortterm training (workforce development) programs during the summer, fall and spring terms in a given academic year at a specific institution.

DUAL ENROLLMENT HEADCOUNT

2021-22 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This measure reflects the percentage of the institution's total annualized headcount enrollment that is comprised of high school students enrolled in college classes while still in high school.

FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE) ENROLLMENT

2021-22 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

Annualized Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) enrollment values represent the sum of all credit hours generated by students enrolled in creditbearing classes, divided by 30, during the summer, fall and spring terms in a given academic year at a specific institution.

FALL FRESHMAN CLASS PROFILE

2021-22 Academic Year | Fall End-of-term Data

This section provides a summary of the academic and demographic characteristics of first-time, full- and part-time, certificate-, associate degree- or bachelor's degree-seeking freshmen matriculating in the fall semester of an academic year. Featured characteristics include gender, race/ethnicity, West Virginia residency status, percentage receiving financial aid through the federal Pell Grant program, and the percentage who earned college credit while in high school through programs such as dual enrollment, Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB).

STUDENT PROFILE

2021-22 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This section provides a summary of the academic and demographic characteristics of all credit-seeking students within an academic year at a given institution, excluding students enrolled solely in SHORT-TERM TRAINING courses.

MINORITY STUDENTS

Students with racial or ethnic minority status are those who self-identify as Hispanic, American Indian or Alaskan Native, Black or African-American, Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, or multi-racial.

PART-TIME STUDENTS

A part-time student is defined as an undergraduate student enrolling in fewer than 12 credit hours in a semester.

FALL-TO-FALL RETENTION

Fall 2020 First-Time Freshman Cohort | Fall End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who enrolled the following fall at the same institution.

FALL-TO-SPRING RETENTION

Fall 2021 First-Time Freshman Cohort | Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who enrolled in the spring semester of the same academic year at the same institution.

FRESHMEN COMPLETING 15 HOURS IN FIRST SEMESTER

Fall 2021 First-Time Freshman Cohort | Fall End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who successfully completed 15 credit hours by the end of the fall semester.

FRESHMEN COMPLETING MATH/ENGLISH COREQUISITE COURSEWORK

Fall 2020 First-Time Freshman Cohort | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who were required to enroll in a corequisite math or English course and successfully completed these courses within two years of enrollment.

TRANSFERRED TO BACHELOR'S PROGRAM

Fall 2020 First-Time Freshman Cohort | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator represents the percentage of first-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who were enrolled in a bachelor's degree program by the end of the following academic year.

ASSOCIATE GRADUATION RATES (TWO- AND THREE-YEAR)

Fall 2019 First-Time Freshman Cohort | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time associate degree-seeking freshmen in a fall entry cohort who earned an associate degree at any public West Virginia institution within two and three years of initial enrollment.

DEGREES AWARDED

2021-22 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

These values represent the total number of academic credentials at the certificate, associate and bachelor's levels awarded by an institution within an academic year. Students earning multiple credentials within an academic year are counted more than once.

GRADUATING CLASS PROFILE

2021-22 Graduates | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This section provides a summary of the academic and demographic characteristics of all associate degree recipients within an academic year. Gender, minority status and West Virginia residency status reflect all graduates. Academic characteristics including average college GPA, years to degree, and credit hours earned are calculated only for graduates who are earning their first associate degree and have started as a first-time freshman at any public in-state institution.

FINANCIAL AID PARTICIPATION RATE

2021-22 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This measure represents the percentage of students receiving federal, state, or institutional grants or waivers divided by the annual unduplicated headcount for the year. It does not include veterans' benefits, vocational rehabilitation benefits, other educational benefits, or loans, but does include work study.

GRADUATE INDEBTEDNESS

2021-22 Graduates | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This section provides data on the percentage of associate degree earners within an academic year who graduated with student loan debt, along with the average total student loan debt that accumulated as of the student's graduation date.

THREE-YEAR STUDENT LOAN DEFAULT RATE

2019 Repayment Cohort | U.S. Department of Education

This measure provides the percentage of a school's borrowers who entered repayment on certain Federal Family Education Loans and/ or William D. Ford Federal Direct Loans in the 2019 fiscal year and entered default status within a three-year period.

WORKFORCE OUTCOMES

2017 Graduates | Institutional Data Submissions; Workforce West Virginia

This section provides the percentage of all recent graduates who earned wages in West Virginia two and four years after graduation, and the median wages earned by certificate and associate degree recipients two and four years after graduation. Median wages are calculated based on those graduates earning wages within all four quarters of a calendar year. These wages do not include graduates who are employed outside of West Virginia, are self-employed, did not earn wages in each of the four quarters of the calendar year, are clergy, are members of the military, or work for the federal government. To protect student privacy, workforce data may be suppressed or unpublished for institutions with small numbers of graduates in the workforce.
