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SECTION ONE: GENERAL INFORMATION AND INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Purpose: West Virginia Northern Community College (hereinafter referred to as the "WVNCC") is soliciting proposals pursuant to **West Virginia Code** §18B-5-4, and subsequently the WV Higher Education Policy Commission & WV Community & Technical College System Purchasing Procedures Manual section 18b-5-9, seeks to procure high-quality executive conference room tables to enhance the functionality and aesthetic appeal of our primary meeting spaces.
- 2. By signing and submitting its proposal, the successful Vendor agrees to be bound by all the terms contained in this Request for Proposal ("RFP"). An RFP is generally used for the procurement of services in situations where price is not the sole determining factor and the award will be based on a combination of cost and technical factors (Best Value). Through its proposal, the bidder offers a solution to the objectives, problem, or need specified in the RFP, and defines how it intends to meet (or exceed) the RFP requirements.

All proposals should be clearly marked "WVNCC Executive Conference Center Tables".

Should a prospective bidder fail to submit a proposal on or before the appointed time at the address shown above, WVNCC will not consider the proposal regardless of the reason for the late submission. WVNCC will keep copies of the proposals in accordance with their record retention policies.

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Deadline for submitting questions is **June 21, 2024.** All questions and answers will be final as of **June 25, 2024.** WVNCC reserves the right to waive any irregularities and reject any or all proposals and to determine the lowest and best bid. Any unauthorized contact will disqualify the vendor from further consideration of this RFP.

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SECTION THREE: GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1) ORDER OF PRECEDENCE: This Addendum modifies and supersedes anything contained on Vendor's form(s) whether or not they are submitted before or after the signing of this Addendum. IN THE EVENT OF ANY CONFLICT BETWEEN VENDOR'S FORM(S) AND THIS ADDENDUM, THIS ADDENDUM SHALL CONTROL.
- 2) PAYMENT Payments for goods/services will be made in arrears only upon receipt of a proper invoice, detailing the goods/services provided or receipt of the goods/services, whichever is later. Notwithstanding the foregoing, payments for software licenses, subscriptions, or maintenance may be paid annually in advance.
- 3) FISCAL YEAR FUNDING- Performance of this Contract is contingent upon funds being appropriated by the WV Legislature or otherwise being available for this Contract. In the event funds are not appropriated or otherwise available, the Contract becomes of no effect and is null and void after June 30 of the current fiscal year. If that occurs, the State may notify the Vendor that an alternative source of funding has been obtained and thereby avoid the automatic termination. Non-appropriation or non-funding shall not be considered an event of default.
- 4) RIGHT TO TERMINATE -The State reserves the right to terminate this Contract upon thirty (30) days written notice to the Vendor. If this right is exercised, the State agrees to pay the Vendor only for all undisputed services rendered or goods received before the termination's effective date. All provisions are deleted that seek to require the State to (1) compensate Vendor, in whole or in part, for lost profit, (2) pay a termination fee, or (3) pay liquidated damages if the Contract is terminated early.
 - Any language seeking to accelerate payments in the event of Contract termination, default. or non-funding is hereby deleted.
- 5) DISPUTES Any language binding the State to any arbitration or to the decision of any arbitration board, commission, panel or other entity is deleted; as is any requirement to waive a jury trial.
 - Any language requiring or permitting disputes under this Contract to be resolved in the courts of any state other than the State of West Virginia is deleted. All legal actions for damages brought by Vendor against the State shall be brought in the West Virginia Claims Commission. Other causes of action must be brought in the West Virginia court authorized by statute to exercise jurisdiction over it.
 - Any language requiring the State to agree to, or be subject to, any form of equitable relief not authorized by the Constitution or laws of State of West Virginia is deleted.
- 6) FEES OR COSTS: Any language obligating the State to pay costs of collection, court costs, or attorney's fees, unless ordered by a court of competent jurisdiction is deleted.
- 7) GOVERNING LAW- Any language requiring the application of the law of any state other than the State of West Virginia in interpreting or enforcing the Contract is deleted. The Contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of West Virginia.

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- 8) RISK SHIFTING- Any provision requiring the State to bear the costs of all or a majority of business/legal risks associated with this Contract. to indemnify the Vendor, or hold the Vendor or a third party harmless for any act or omission is hereby deleted.
- 9) LIMITING LIABILITY-Any language limiting the Vendor's liability for direct damages to person or property is deleted.
- 10) TAXES- Any provisions requiring the State to pay Federal, State or local taxes or file tax returns or reports on behalf of Vendor are deleted. The State will, upon request, provide a tax-exempt certificate to confirm its tax-exempt status.
- 11) NO WAIVER-Any provision requiring the State to waive any rights, claims or defenses is hereby deleted.
- 12) STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS-Any clauses limiting the time in which the State may bring suit against the Vendor or any other third party are deleted.
- 13) ASSIGNMENT-The Vendor agrees not to assign the Contract to any person or entity without the State's prior written consent, which will not be unreasonably delayed or denied. The State reserves the right to assign this Contract to another State agency, board or commission upon thirty (30) days written notice to the Vendor. These restrictions do not apply to the payments made by the State. Any assignment will not become effective and binding upon the State until the State is notified of the assignment, and the State and Vendor execute a change order to the Contract.
- 14) RENEWAL- Any language that seeks to automatically renew, modify, or extend the Contract beyond the initial term or automatically continue the Contract period from term to term is deleted. The Contract may be renewed or continued only upon mutual written agreement of the Parties.
- 15) INSURANCE -Any provision requiring the State to maintain any type of insurance for either its or the Vendor's benefit is deleted.
- 16) RIGHT TO REPOSSESSION NOTICE- Any provision for repossession of equipment without notice is hereby deleted. However, the State does recognize a right of repossession with notice.
- 17) DELIVERY-All deliveries under the Contract will be FOB destination unless the State expressly and knowingly agrees otherwise. Any contrary delivery terms are hereby deleted.
- 18) CONFIDENTIALITY Any provisions regarding confidential treatment or non-disclosure of the terms and conditions of the Contract are hereby deleted. State contracts are public records under the West Virginia Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA") (W. Va. Code §29B-a-1, et seq.) and public procurement laws. This Contract and other public records may be disclosed without notice to the vendor at the State's sole discretion.

Any provisions regarding confidentiality or non-disclosure related to contract performance are only effective to the extent they are consistent with FOIA and incorporated into the Contract through a separately approved and signed non-disclosure agreement.

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- 19) THIRD-PARTY SOFTWARE- If this Contract contemplates or requires the use of third-party software, the vendor represents that none of the mandatory click-through, unsigned, or web-linked terms and conditions presented or required before using such third-party software conflict with any term of this Addendum or that is has the authority to modify such third-party software's terms and conditions to be subordinate to this Addendum. The Vendor shall indemnify and defend the State against all claims resulting from an assertion that such third-party terms and conditions are not in accord with, or subordinate to, this Addendum.
- 20) AMENDMENTS-The parties agree that all amendments, modifications, alterations or changes to the Contract shall be by mutual agreement, in writing, and signed by both parties. Any language to the contrary is deleted.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, this Addendum can only be amended by (1) identifying the alterations to this form by using *Italics* to identify language being added and strikethrough for language being deleted (do not use track-changes) and (2) having the Office of the West Virginia Attorney General's authorized representative expressly agree to and knowingly approve those alterations.

SECTION FOUR: PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS

- 1) **Location:** 1704 Market St., Wheeling WV 26003
- 2) Background and Current Operating Environment: WVNCC is a public 2-year higher education institution with campuses in New Martinsville, Weirton, & Wheeling, WV. The College provides traditional classroom learning for degree seeking students, technical training in a variety of trades, and resources for workforce development meeting the needs of the local business and industry.
- 3) **Introduction:** The following scope of services outlines the requirements, responsibilities, and tasks involved in the installation of Executive Conference Center tables at WVNCC.
- 4) **Project Overview:** WVNCC seeks to procure high-quality executive conference room tables to enhance the functionality and aesthetic appeal of our primary meeting spaces. The new tables will be used in our executive conference room, which serves as a central hub for strategic planning, board meetings, faculty gatherings, and community events. The tables must embody professionalism, durability, and adaptability to various meeting formats.
- 5) **Scope of Work:** The scope of work includes, but is not limited to, the following:
 - 1. Objectives:
 - Professionalism: The tables should reflect the college's commitment to excellence and provide an environment conducive to high-level discussions and decisionmaking.
 - ii. Durability: Given the frequency of use, the tables must be constructed from robust materials that can withstand regular wear and tear.

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iii. Adaptability: The design should accommodate different seating arrangements and integrate seamlessly with existing audiovisual and communication technologies.

2. Requirements:

- i. Design: Contemporary and elegant, complementing the existing decor.
- ii. Materials: High-quality, durable, and easy to maintain.
- iii. Functionality: Modular configurations, cable management features, and compatibility with AV equipment.
- 3. Dimensions: To fit the specific layout of the conference room (detailed dimensions provided in the full RFP).

4. Specifications:

- i. Eight (8) Rectangular 84" long x 42" wide x 30" high units.
- ii. Single section 1 1/8" thick tops with Wilsonart premium laminate or equivalent.
- iii. 3" wide x 1 1/8" thick solid wood edge.
- iv. Includes under mounted daisy link power ports.
- v. Each modular table will include (1) ports each with (2) AC & (2) USB
- vi. Each table will include a 72" power in feed cord.
- vii. (4) tables can be powered from a single in feed cord.
- viii. ARDMS style modular base.
- ix. Includes integrated furniture glide with swivel casters for easy mobility.
- x. Includes ganging hardware for easy assembly. No tools required.
- xi. Includes palletized shipping direct to 1704 Market Street, Wheeling WV 26003.

5. Material/Finish:

- i. Top center and base sides Wilsonart Portico Teak 8210K-28 or equivalent.
- ii. Top edges and base foot Sapele "Ebonized"
- 6. Timeline: The installation timeline will be determined based on project requirements, including site preparation, material procurement, and product delivery. A detailed project

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schedule will be developed and shared with stakeholders to ensure transparency and accountability.

- 7. Budget: The budget for the Executive Conference Center Tables will cover all costs associated with procurement, manufacture, and delivery. Any deviations from the budget will be communicated promptly to stakeholders for approval.
- 8. Quality Assurance: Quality assurance measures will be implemented throughout the build process to ensure compliance with client requirements.
- 6) **Mandatory Requirements:** The following mandatory requirements must be met by the Vendor as a part of the submitted proposal. Failure on the part of the Vendor to meet any of the mandatory specifications shall result in the disqualification of the proposal. The terms "must", "will", "shall", "minimum", "maximum", or "is/are required" identify a mandatory item or factor. Decision regarding compliance with any mandatory requirements shall be at the sole discretion of the Purchasing Division. Vendors will provide:

- 1. To ensure that proposals meet the standards and needs of WVNCC, the following mandatory requirements must be met by all bidders:
- 2. Design and Aesthetics:
 - a. Tables must have a contemporary, professional design that aligns with the existing decor of the conference room.
 - b. Must include high-quality finishes and materials that convey a sense of professionalism and durability.
- 3. Material Specifications:
 - a. Tables must be made from durable, high-quality materials that can withstand frequent use.
 - b. Surfaces should be resistant to scratches, stains, and easy to clean.
 - c. Tables must comply with sustainability standards, utilizing environmentally friendly materials where possible.

4. Functionality:

- a. Tables should be modular, allowing for various configurations to accommodate different meeting formats.
- b. Must include integrated cable management systems to keep the workspace organized and free of clutter.

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c. Should be compatible with existing audiovisual and communication equipment, with provisions for easy integration.

5. Dimensions and Capacity:

- a. Tables must be designed to fit multiple layouts of the executive conference room.
- b. Must accommodate a minimum of 24 individuals comfortably, with appropriate space for seating and movement.

6. Durability and Maintenance:

- a. Tables should be constructed to withstand regular use and maintain their appearance over time.
- b. Maintenance requirements should be minimal, with easy-to-follow cleaning and upkeep instructions.

7. Compliance and Safety:

a. Tables must meet all relevant safety standards and regulations.

8. Warranty and Support:

- a. Bidders must provide a minimum warranty period of 3 years covering defects in materials and workmanship.
- b. Must include details of post-purchase support, including maintenance services and availability of replacement parts.

9. Delivery and Installation:

- a. Bidders must include a detailed plan for the delivery and installation of the tables.
- b. Installation must be completed by 12 weeks after an approved Purchase Order has been issued, with minimal disruption to the college's operations.

10. Cost and Payment Terms:

- a. A comprehensive cost breakdown, including all materials, labor, delivery, and installation fees, must be provided.
- b. Clear terms of payment, including any required deposits and final payment schedules.

11. Proposal Submission:

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- a. All proposals must be submitted by July 2, 2024.
- b. Proposals must include detailed design concepts, material specifications, pricing, timelines, and any other relevant documentation.

Failure to meet any of these mandatory requirements will result in disqualification from the bidding process. WVNCC reserves the right to request additional information or clarification from bidders as needed.

SECTION FIVE: VENDOR PROPOSAL

- 1) **Preparation:** Proposals should be prepared simply and economically providing a straightforward, concise description of the Vendor's abilities to satisfy the requirements of the RFP. Emphasis should be placed on completeness and clarity of the content.
- 2) **Incurring Cost:** Neither the State nor any of its employees or officers shall be held liable for any expenses incurred by any Vendor responding to this RFP, including but not limited to preparation, delivery, or travel.
- 3) **Proposal Format:** Vendors should provide responses in the format listed below:
 - 1. **Title Page:** State the RFP subject, number, Vendor's name, business address, telephone number, fax number, name of contact person, e-mail address, and Vendor signature and date.
 - 2. **Table of Contents:** Clearly identify the material by section and page number.
 - 3. **Attachment A -** Information regarding the firm, their connection to the local community, general qualifications, and knowledge of higher education if applicable.
 - 4. **Attachment B -** Pricing schedule encompassing items outlined in Section Four Subsection 3.
 - 5. Attachment C Signed certification of agreement.
- 4) **Proposal Submission:** Proposals will be reviewed in two distinct parts: technical and cost.
 - 1. All proposals will be evaluated based on lowest cost and best comparison to specifications provided in Section 4.
 - 2. All proposals must be submitted **prior** to the date and time stipulated in the RFP as the opening date. All bids will be dated and time stamped to verify official time and date of receipt. All submissions must be in accordance with the provisions listed below and in Section 2: Instructions to Bidders Submitting Bids above.
- 5) **Bid Opening:** The Evaluation Committee shall publicly open and announce cost proposals on **July 2, 2024** at 2:30 PM. All bids for qualifying proposals will be opened. A proposal may be

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deemed non-qualifying for a number of reasons including, but not limited to, the bidder's technical proposal failing to meet the minimum acceptable score and the bidder's technical proposal failing to meet a mandatory requirement of the contract. Certain information, such as technical scores and reasons for disqualification, will not be available until after the contract award, pursuant to **West Virginia Code** §5A-3-11(h) and **West Virginia Code** of **State Rules** §148-1-6.2.5.

SECTION SIX: EVALUATION AND AWARD

- 1) Evaluation Process: Proposals will be evaluated by an "Evaluation Committee" against the established criteria with points deducted for deficiencies. The Vendor who demonstrates that they meet all of the mandatory specifications required; and has appropriately presented within their written response their understanding in meeting the goals and objectives of the project; and attains the highest overall point score of all Vendors shall be awarded the contract. The selection of the successful Vendor will be made by a consensus of the evaluation committee.
- **2) Evaluation Criteria:** All evaluation criteria are defined in the specifications section and based on a 100-point total score.
 - 1. The following are the evaluation factors and maximum points possible for technical point scores:

Total	100 Points Possible
Cost	50 Points Possible
Service & Support	10 Points Possible
Availability of Features	15 Points Possible
Firm Credentials & References	25 Points Possible

3) Minimum Acceptable Score: Vendors must score a minimum of 80% (80 points) of the total points possible. All Vendors not attaining the minimum acceptable score (MAS) shall be considered as non-qualifying. A proposal may be deemed non-qualifying for a number of reasons including but not limited to, the bidder's technical proposal failing to meet the minimum acceptable score and the bidder's technical proposal failing to meet a mandatory requirement of the contract. Cost bids for non-qualifying proposals will also be opened but shall not be considered. Certain information, such as technical scores and reasons for disqualification, will not be available until after the contract award, pursuant to West Virginia Code §5A-3-11(h) and West Virginia Code of State Rules §148-1-6.2.5.
